The RBM Case Management Working Group meeting brings together stakeholders representing national malaria control and elimination programs, malaria-affected country organizations, regional and international organizations, research groups, and other interested parties to share lessons learned and best practices for scaling up high quality malaria case management services.

The objectives of the meeting are:

- To provide updates on state of the art and hot topics in malaria case management.
- To convene country representatives and malaria partners to share experiences and evidence on best practices for improving malaria case management.

Meeting Venue

All sessions of the meeting will take place at the Lemigo Hotel in Kigali, Rwanda (Lemigo Hall 1). Selected sessions will be live-streamed.

Meeting Languages

The meeting will be held in English with simultaneous translation in French.

Registration Fee

The registration fee (EUR 200 per participant) includes a documentation package, writing pad and pen, a bag, as well as the tea breaks in the morning with assorted snacks, lunch breaks with a soft drink, tea breaks in the afternoon with assorted snacks, two bottles of water per day for the duration of the meeting.

Selected National Malaria Control Program representatives will be sponsored and notified by the Organizers.

We will be setting aside some time for selected participants to give brief 10–20 minutes presentations on recent results of their program work or research. Travel Requirements

Visa

Citizens of most countries could issue travel visas for Rwanda at the airport.

It is advised to have with you hard copies of your travel documents (passport, flight ticket & itinerary, hotel reservation, travel insurance, health insurance, visa arrangements).

COVID-19

Since COVID-19 protocols are constantly changing, kindly check [here for updated information](#)

For the time being, arriving passengers at Kigali International Airport must present a negative Rapid Test taken 72 hours prior to departure (meaning travelers must be tested and get results within 3 days of their first flight).

All travelers arriving and transiting in must complete the passenger locator form and upload the Covid-19 Rapid test certificate taken within 72 hours before heading to the airport. [Passenger locator form](#)

Plugs



For Rwanda there are two associated plug types, types C and J. Plug type C is the plug which has two round pins and plug type J is the plug which has three

round pins. Rwanda operates on a 230V supply voltage and 50Hz.

Time Zone



Time in Rwanda is denoted as Central Africa Time (CAT; UTC+02:00).

Weather in June

Daily high temperatures are around 26°C/79°F, rarely falling below 23°C/75°F. Daily low temperatures are around 16°C/62°F, rarely falling below 14°C/ 58°F.

Currency

The Rwandan Franc (RWF) is the principal currency in Rwanda. US Dollars are widely accepted.

1 USD = 1009 RWF (as of 25/4/2022)

Kigali, Rwanda

Known as the land of a thousand hills, Rwanda's stunning scenery and warm, friendly people offer unique experiences in one of the most remarkable countries in the world. It is blessed with extraordinary biodiversity, with incredible wildlife living throughout its volcanoes, montane rainforest and sweeping plains. Kigali is the capital of Rwanda. It is located in the centre of the country on the Rugezi River.



Genocide Memorial

The [Kigali Genocide Memorial](#) is a commemorative and educational institution, which commemorates the 1994 genocide in Rwanda. It is the central one of six larger memorials of the approximately 200 institutions of this kind in the country.



Inema Arts Center

The [Center](#) is located in the heart of Kigali and it is housing a collection of artists from around the African continent. Founded in 2012 by brothers and self-taught painters Emmanuel Nkuranga and Innocent Nkurunziza.



Kimironko Market

The [market](#) is located in the Kimironko neighbourhood, where vendors sell fruits, vegetables, fabric, clothing and household necessities.
